How do we help the STARS?

STARS Children Africa is a charitable organization. The founders have a combined 30 years of international non-government, business, government and voluntary service. We volunteer. All support received goes for the STARS.

Our volunteer partners administer and account for the funds that pay the education costs of the STARS. They mentor the STARS using their years of experience serving orphans. They are committed and lead with conviction. Some grew up as orphans.



Joshua Atieno, as an orphan, finished high school with support of others. As a father, he received a scholarship to study in the United States, but it lasted only one year.

He had to work to earn his degree from Eastern University - Philadelphia.



While he studied in the USA, his wife, **Abigail**, raised their five children while teaching. She led their joint commitment to both the orphans and widows.



Anthony Wanyoike and his wife have four children. He began helping his town’s street boys in the 1990’s. He now heads a home for 55 boys ages 4–18.

Where are the STARS?

Our supported STARS are in 25 high schools in three areas of Kenya, East Africa. The STARS attend both day and boarding schools. These schools are around the towns of Kisumu in the west, Nakuru in the central and Machakos, south of Nairobi the Capitol of Kenya.
